Gerry Kinneavy joined Labyrinth Network in 2006 when the organization was founded and remained a member until his death on December 20, 2018. After his retirement from the University of Colorado, Gerry became a Chaplain with North Lincoln Hospice in Lincoln City, Oregon. In his work with hospice, Gerry used the labyrinth many ways.



Gerry taught the hospice staff and patients many ways labyrinths could be used. He held an annual memorial labyrinth walk, putting on the labyrinth the names of patients who had died in the previous year. He wrote a curriculum based on the labyrinth to use with his grief support groups, and gave each member a finger labyrinth which he recommended that they use to help them through the bad times especially when they woke in the middle of the night.

Gerry also hosted Blue Holiday Celebrations for people who had recently lost a loved one to help them chase away the sadness they often feel during the holiday season. The event featured lavish blue decorations, a soup and salad dinner, Taize prayer and a Labyrinth Walk.
